Safety

- Proper lightning protection is an important aspect of designing a safe amateur radio station
- Recently, many amateurs have become concerned about possible damage from EMP, or Electromagnetic Pulse
- Fortunately, EMP protection has been studied by Dennis Bodson, W4PWF, and effective mitigation strategies published in QST

Training



- The General Message (ICS 213) is used by the incident dispatchers to record incoming messages that cannot be orally transmitted to the intended recipients.
- Used by the Incident Command Post and other incident personnel to transmit messages to the Incident Communications Center for transmission
- Used to send any message or notification to incident personnel that requires hard-copy delivery



- Formal messages are not needed for most
- "Real-Time" Tactical Communications:
- Direct conversations between third parties
- Life-safety matters when timing is critical
- Most routine task assignments
- Most routine task completions
- Most routine resource coordination
- Record routine exchanges as line-items in you
- ICS Form 309 Comm Log



Block Number	Block Title	Instructions
1	Incident Name (Optional)	Enter the name assigned to the incident
2	To (Name and Position)	Who's it going to?
3	From (Name and Position)	Coming from?
4	Subject	Enter Subject of Message
5	Date	(Month / Day / Year)
6	Time	24-hour clock (Local Time)
7	Message	Try to be as CONCISE as possible
8	Approved By	Name, Signature and ICS Position approving the message
9	Reply	Intended Recipient will enter a reply and return to originator
10	Replied By
